- New Richmond Voter Districts (2012) were established per Richmond City Council 2011 Richmond Decennial Voter District Redistricting & Council Ord. # 2011-185 (As Amended) on Nov. 28, 2011 in response to 2010 U.S. Census to reflect population shifts. Used to elect Richmond City Council, Richmond Public Schools Board of Trustees and Mayor. U.S. Department of Justice preclearance to use received March 9, 2012. Redistricting of Richmond Voter Districts is performed once every ten years (decennially).
- Richmond Voter Districts are used by Richmond Residents to elect Richmond City Council, Richmond Public Schools Board of Trustees, and Mayor (who must earn the most votes in five of the nine Richmond Voter Districts).

\*Note: Hispanic/Latino is not an official racial category, it is an ethnic category that could also include other races.
