

## Who is the Commission of Architectural Review?

**James Klaus, Chair** – Mr. Klaus was appointed in 2015 as a citizen-at-large member and is scheduled to serve until September 2021. He is a former board member of the Historic Richmond Foundation and the Fan District Association and the former Chairman of the Board of the Valentine Museum. He currently in CEO of a retail company and resides in the Fan District.

**G. Jason Hendricks, Vice-Chair** – Mr. Hendricks was appointed in 2014 as a citizen-at-large member, and is scheduled to serve through March 2020. He is an architect at HKS Architects. Mr. Hendricks resides in the Springhill Old and Historic District.
