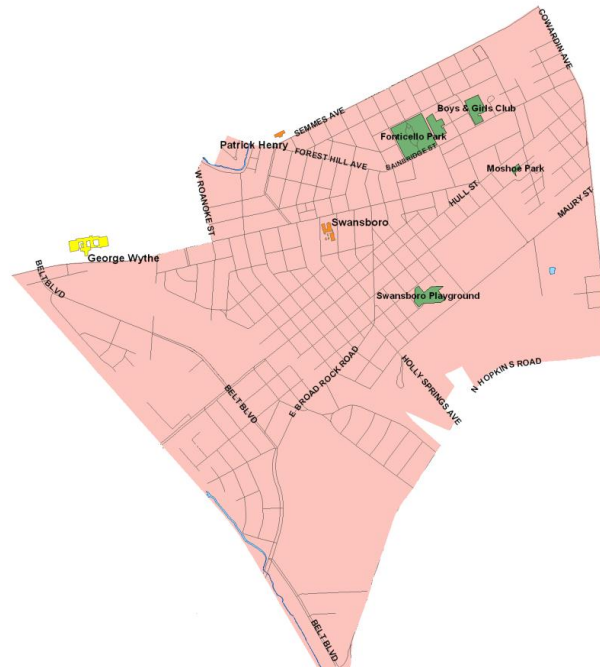

- **Don't carry large sums of cash.**
- **If you see something suspicious, call the police!**

SIGNIFICANT ARREST IN SECTOR 211:

On May 22, 2011 at approximately 9:00 AM a call for an armed robbery came in for Circle Shopping Center. Officer Anthony Ratliff was quickly on scene and able to get a detailed suspect description for other officers in the area. Officer Ratliff was able to determine that the victim's phone had been stolen and was equipped with a family locator application. Officer Ratliff and Officer Wade were able to utilize this technology to locate and apprehend the suspect. The suspect, Christopher C. Lewis, was charged with Robbery, Use of a Firearm in the Commission of a Felony, Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon and Obstruction of Justice. This incident shows Officer Ratliff's diligence and desire to take a serious offender of the streets of Richmond.
