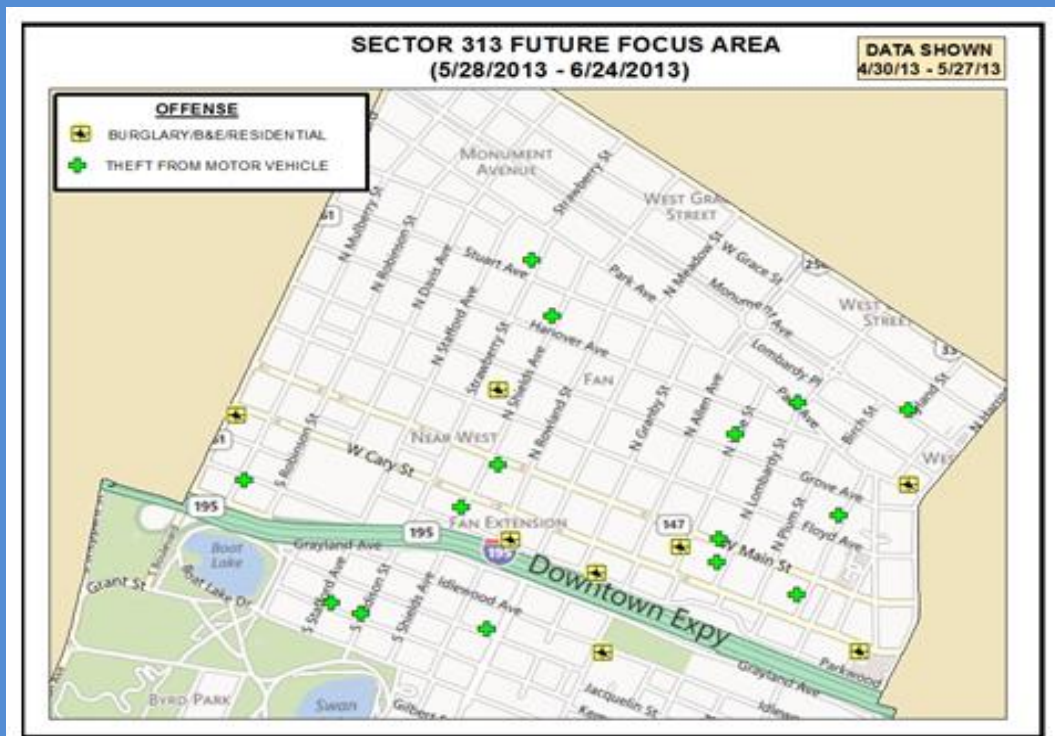

With the approach of the warmer climate the Police Dept. invites you to enjoy the verdure of the park system within Sector 313 and the city as a whole. However always remember to be aware of your surroundings, travel in groups, and avoid displaying large sums of money. Should you find yourself the victim of a crime, contact the Police Dept. as soon as possible, and try to get a good description of the suspect(s) and memorize the license plate on the suspect vehicle.



Sector 313: (April 30, 2013 – May 27, 2013) Focus

Violent Crime: **75% Decrease**

2012 vs. 2013- Four (4) vs. One (1)

Property Crime: **7% Increase**

2012 vs. 2013 – Fifty-eight (58) vs. Sixty-two (62)

Major Crime: **2 % Increase**

2012 vs. 2013 – Sixty -two (62) vs. Sixty-three (63)

Robbery – Individual

2012 vs. 2013 – Zero (0) vs. Zero (0)

During the 28 day period (April 30 through May 27) Sector 313 showed a slight (7%) increase in property crimes. This was fueled by a 300% increase in thefts from motor vehicles, where 20 were recorded when compared to five for the same time period the previous year.

Residential burglaries were down by 40%; however the sector recorded nine burglaries. Please remember to check and double check doors and windows before leaving home. Do not provide an easy target.

Please encourage your neighbors to report their homes to the Police Dept., as vacation homes when they are away for extended periods of time. Help us to help you. Go to the city website: richmondgov.com.

Here are a few tips on hardening the environment around your homes:

Neighborhood watch

Activate your alarm systems

Security cameras

Metal door frames

Door clubs

Trim hedges and shrubs

Security fences (that do not obscure vision)

Do not leave valuables visible from a window

Be aware of dog signs
