Overall for June the sector was up 8 violent crimes from 6 in 2008 to 14 in 2009. In property crime we broke even with 49 crimes reported in 2008 and 2009. Major crime was up because of the violent crime trend by 8, from 55 in 2008 to 63 in 2009, for a 15% increase. Although the sector did have an increase in violent crimes caused by a spike in robberies reported in Hillside Court, property crime did well maintaining its same level as in 2008. In late June, resources were deployed to Hillside Court in an effort to prevent those incidents from continuing, and have already shown good success.

As June closed we all look forward to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July festivities and celebrating our nations birth. As the month moves forward remember to stay alert for suspicious activity, the economy is still on the mend and many people find themselves in desperate times and maybe forced towards criminal acts. Blackwell, violent crime, 2 in 08 compared to 1 in 09. (Outstanding)

Property crime, 11 in 08 compared to 13 in 09. (Shoplifting x 2 and Auto Theft)

Officers will be focusing in the areas of Blackwell, Hillside and Shockoe to impact violent crime and theft from autos, also in July, Hull Street will see the return of the "Beat Cop", Officer Deadra Swilley will begin walking daily on the 6<sup>th</sup>.
