Greetings,

Neighbors, citizens, countrymen, Sector 112 had an eventful May; we continued our strong push through the quarter by following a strong April with an equally strong May, however we did have three significant events that dampened our month. We reported 3 murders in May; one in Hillside Court, one in Oak Grove on Dinwiddie and one in Blackwell on 14th Street between Decatur and Hull Streets. Each of these is being investigated with the utmost sense of urgency and should have arrests forthcoming in the following months.

Overall for May the sector was up 1 violent crime from 12 in 2008 to 13 in 2009. In property crime we were down 4 crimes, from 43 in 2008 to 39 in 2009, a slight improvement. Overall major crime was down as well by 3 crimes, from 55 in 2008 to 52 in 2009, for a 5% reduction. This reduction allowed Sector 112 to maintain its first place position for the 2nd quarter crime reduction award. Each of you is credited with helping in maintaining this crime reduction, and I ask each of you for your continued keen observation and support throughout the crime fighting season.

As the end of the school session draws near it's important to stay vigilant. Crimes that tend to spike during the summer holidays are home break-ins, thefts from cars and motor vehicle theft. Vandalisms and increased graffiti also tend to spike during the long summer solstice. Call when you see kids engaged in malicious behavior; let's set the tone for summer early.

Oak Grove, violent crime, 1 in 08 compared to 1 in 09.

Property crime, 7 in 08 compared to 7 in 09. (No change, very good)

Manchester, violent crime, 0 in 08 compared to 1 in 09.

Property Crime, 10 in 08 compared to 10 in 09. (Theft from vehicles and Break-ins)

Shockoe, violent crime, 2 in 08 compared to 4 in 09. (Bar fights)
Property crime, 10 in 08 compared to 9 in 09.

Hillside Court, violent crime, 1 in 08 compared to 0 in 09.
Property crime, 2 in 08 compared to 2 in 09.

Blackwell, violent crime, 6 in 08 compared to 5 in 09.
Property crime, 12 in 08 compared to 8 in 09. (Veterans Club, 1315
Hull St has suspended operations and is moving)

During the next 30 days officers will continue to attack problems that tend to spike our crime issues. Officers will be focusing in the combined areas of Blackwell and Manchester to impact property crime and drug dealing along Decatur and Halifax Ave. Additional directed patrol will be deployed along with an increase in walking and bike patrols.
