



# First Precinct - Sector 111 Community Report September 2009

During the month of September, the Sector experienced a 0% change in Major Crime; a 200% increase in violent crime (4 incidents reported in 2008 compared to 12 in 2009) and a 13% decrease in property crime (61 incidents reported in 2008 compared to 53 in 2009). The 12 violent crimes reported included: 1 Aggravated Assault (Domestic related), 5 Aggravated Assaults and 6 robberies. Of the 12 violent incidents reported 7 of them have been cleared by arrest, one was committed by a known person that hasn't been located and the remaining 4 are still being investigated by detectives. The current trend in Property Crime continues to be residential burglaries and most recently all other larceny, which includes everything from bicycles to flags attached to the front porch.

During this reporting period, Sector 111 officers answered 1974 radio calls, compiled 209 reports and investigated 23 vehicle accidents. They also made 118 misdemeanor arrests, 27 felony arrests, executed 58 warrants, issued 82 traffic summons, seized 4 guns and conducted 86 field interviews. Below is a breakdown of some of the significant arrests;

### CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

Thefts from motor vehicles:

- Always keep your vehicle locked.
- Don't leave your car running or spare keys inside.
- Take personal items in your home/apartment or secure in the trunk - especially IPod's, GPS's and change.
- Inform your guests about leaving items in the interior of their vehicles.

Burglaries:

- Make sure you always lock your doors and windows when you leave home.
- If you are working in the rear yard, be sure to lock your front door.
- Don't leave items out that can be used to gain entry through a window, such as ladders.
- Keep shrubs and trees trimmed.
- Make sure sheds and outbuildings are always locked.
- Get to know your neighbors -keep a watch on each others property and exchange contact numbers in case there is an emergency.
- Don't leave items unsecured in your yard such as bikes and lawn mowers; this sometimes invites criminals onto your property.
- Notify the Police Dept if you are going on vacation or out of town on business.
