THE BREAKDOWN

Robberies of Individuals:

CARY: 10-16-09 2800 blk Idlewood Ave. Known suspect stole victim's necklace from his person. **Wanted is Troy Mark Banton b/m, 46 YOA, LKA 1900 blk of Lakeview Ave.**

HGNT: 10-14-09 Stony Point Rd (shopping center parking lot). The victim is a jewelry merchant from New York. He alleges that 3 masked men (believed to be Hispanic males according to the victim) accosted him in the parking lot and robbed him at gunpoint of over \$300,000 dollars worth of jewelry that he'd brought to Richmond to sell to jewelry retailers.

MVGD: 10-21-09 4500 blk of Wythe Ave. Victim alleged he was robbed (possibly at gunpoint, victim assumed the subject was armed but didn't "see" a firearm) as he walked toward his home. Taken were his ID, cell phone and backpack. All items except the cell phone have been recovered. Suspect was described as a W/M, early 20's, 5' 10", 160 lbs, clean shaven.

MUSD: 10-25-09 700 blk N. Nanesmond St. Three victims stated that they had just exited their vehicle when they were approached by 3 black males. One of the suspects was armed with a handgun. The victims were robbed of their cell phones and other misc. items. The suspects were described as black males between 17 – 25 years of age, 5' 6" – 5' 9" Suspects fled on foot. K9 responded but found no traceable track.

ROBBERY/RESIDENTIAL:

CARN: 10-12-09 3000 blk Grant St. Victim's allege to 2 b/m entered their residence and robbed them at gunpoint. A small amount of marijuana and an xbox 360 were amongst the items taken. The investigation of this crime led to **the arrest of Barry L. Thomas, b/m 25 YOA from Chesterfield Co.** who denies any involvement in this offense. Another suspect in this case is still being sought and the investigation continues.

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES:

MUSD:

10-02-09 2800 blk Monument Ave. – Victim alleges that an unk subject entered his unlocked apt while he slept and took his work laptop from the couch in his living room. The laptop was then allegedly sold on the street to an unk person who returned same to the victim's place of employment. This case remains under investigation.

10-19-09 3000 Blk of Patterson Ave. – Tools stolen from an apt. under renovation.

CARY: 10-27-09 100 Blk of S. Colonial Ave - Suspect entered the victim's residence and stole a Sony Playstation. The victim returned to his residence to find the suspect still in the basement. The suspect was located by the police and arrested. **Joshua A. Gerdts, W/M, 23, was arrested.**
