## THE BREAKDOWN

### Attempted Robbery of an Individual:

**MUSD:** 09-28-09 1210 hrs 3000 blk of Stuart Ave.

The victim, a high school student, alleges that he was taking photos when the suspect grabbed his right shoulder and demanded money. The suspect was armed with a knife and the victim received a minor cut on his forearm. The robbery was interrupted by a resident coming out to his car, scaring the suspect off. The suspect was described as a W/M, 6', 170 lbs. with short brown hair and tattoos on his right arm down to the elbow. He was wearing jeans and a white tee shirt. NO further description. Police were notified approx. 2 hrs after the incident occurred..

When the victim entered their residence they noticed that some things were out of place, but didn't think anything of it at first. They eventually made it back to a bedroom where they noticed that several rings were missing from a jewelry box. Nothing else appeared to be missing at the time of the report. The house was secured, and it appears the "suspect" may have gained entry with a key. Suspect may be a former associate of the victim.
